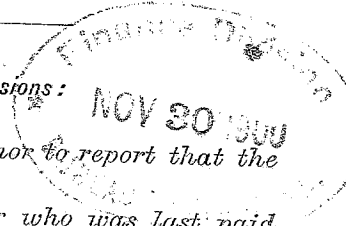

While serving in Co. H, 127 Reg't Pa. Vols he was disabled by "disability" - Died 28 Aug 1869 -

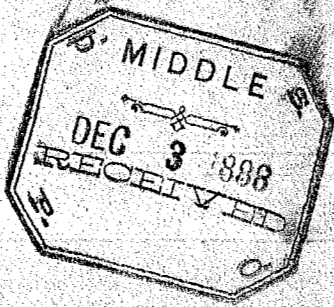

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S ARMY PENSION.

STATE OF Pa
County of Dauphin } SS:

On the 23 day of July A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty-
Eight personally appeared before me, Prothonotary Clerk of the
Circuit Court within and for the County and State aforesaid, Sarah A. Weaver
a resident of Harrisburg in the County of Dauphin
and State of Pa aged 55 years, who being first duly sworn according to law,

doth, on her oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the Act
of Congress, approved July 14, 1862. That she is the widow of George H. Weaver
who enlisted in the service of the United States at Harrisburg in the
State of Pa on the 31 day of July 1862, as a
private in Company D commanded by Capt H. ...
in the 127 Regiment of Pa Infy, in the war of 1861; and again
enlisted in Co. F. 201. Pa Infy. Aug 12. 1864, & discharged June 21. 1865.
who, while in the service aforesaid, in the line of his duty incurred
disability and died

at Buncannon in the State of Pa on the 28 day of
Aug A. D. 1869. She further declares that she was married to the said

George H. Weaver in the County of Dauphin and State
of Pa on the 25 day of Nov in the year 1852
that her name before said marriage was Sarah A. Kelly that her husband,

the aforesaid George H. Weaver died on the day above mentioned, and that
she has remained a widow ever since that period, as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed.
She further swears that she has the following named children of her deceased husband and herself, under sixteen
years of age, who are now living, the dates of whose births were given below, to-wit:

- Ellena Weaver born on the 21 day of October 1857
- Savina Weaver born on the 21 day of November 1859
- Juliana Weaver born on the 22 day of July 1861
- Emalia Weaver born on the 17 day of May 1864
- Maria Weaver born on the 22 day of December 1867
- May E. Weaver born on the 22 day of June 1869

And that the above named children are the only legitimate children of herself and her said husband, now living, who
are under sixteen years of age. She further declares that she has not remarried since the death of her said hus-
band, nor has she abandoned the support of any one of the children above named, nor permitted any one of the
same to be adopted by any other person or persons, as his, her or their child.

And further, that her said husband has left no minor child run by a
former marriage which had ever been married

She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in or aided or abetted the rebellion in the
United States. She hereby appoints J. C. Woodburn of
Harrisburg State of Pa her true and lawful Attorney, with full
power of substitution to prosecute this claim for pension, and to receive the certificate that may be issued therefor.

She requests that her pension be paid at Philada Pa State of

They further declare that she has remained a widow ever since her husband's decease.

They further swear that they or either of them, have no interest in this claim, either present or prospective; and that they are not concerned, directly or indirectly, in its prosecution, and are not near relatives of the claimant.
